Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

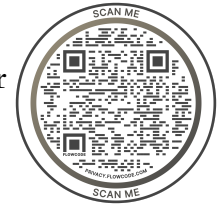

Alleluia! Greetings, Family! ¡Aleluya! ¡Saludos familia!

I was blessed to be in the path of totality on April 8. It was pretty amazing. (And the music was awesome!). About 10 minutes before totality, as the sun was more than 90% covered, the stars and planets started coming out! They were there already, of course, but now that the sun was diminished they became visible. Then, when the sun was completely covered... there they were! Many, many of them! The sun was still UP THERE, but with its visual noise silenced the other things could be seen. (Including other aspects of the sun!) *Tuve la bendición de estar en el camino de la totalidad el 8 de abril. Fue bastante sorprendente. ¡Y la música era increíble!. Aproximadamente 10 minutos antes de la totalidad, cuando el sol estaba cubierto en más del 90%, ¡las estrellas y los planetas comenzaron a salir! Ya estaban allí, por supuesto, pero ahora que el sol disminuyó se hicieron visibles. Entonces, cuando el sol se cubrió por completo... ¡allí estaban! ¡Muchos, muchos de ellos! El sol todavía estaba ARRIBA, pero con su ruido visual silenciado se podían ver las demás cosas. ¡Incluidos otros aspectos del sol!*

I wonder how much we are missing paying attention to the things that are screaming for us to notice them. I wonder if we could convince our souls to eclipse the noise, what other things we might see. As the two unnamed disciples were walking to Emmaus, their eyes were closed to Jesus, EVEN WHEN HE WAS WALKING ALONG WITH THEM, TALKING to them about HIMSELF! If THESE disciples couldn't see him when he was RIGHT THERE talking in the third person, perhaps we should be gentle with ourselves. But just the same, the Son, like the sun, can be right there, and we might not notice. *Me pregunto cuánto nos falta prestar atención a las cosas que nos gritan que las notemos. Me pregunto si podríamos convencer a nuestras almas de eclipsar el ruido, qué otras cosas podríamos ver. Mientras los dos discípulos anónimos caminaban hacia Emaús, sus ojos estaban cerrados para ver a Jesús, ¡INCLUSO CUANDO ÉL CAMINABA CON ELLOS, HABLÁNDOLES DE SÍ MISMO! Si ESTOS discípulos no pudieron verlo cuando estaba AHÍ hablando en tercera persona, tal vez deberíamos ser amables con nosotros mismos. Pero de todos modos, el Hijo, como el sol, puede estar ahí mismo y es posible que no nos demos cuenta.*

That's why love that Collect that asks the Father to open the eyes or our hearts, that we might SEE Jesus in all his redeeming work. It's Easter! The tomb is empty. Where is Jesus? Maybe right in front of us, begging us to silence the noise. *Por eso me encanta esa Colecta que pide al Padre que abra los ojos o el corazón, para que podamos VER a Jesús en toda su obra redentora. ¡Es Pascua! La tumba está vacía. ¿Dónde está Jesús? Quizás justo frente a nosotros, rogándonos que silencemos el ruido*
